

Combining physical gaming pieces with a virtual board, iPieces allows you to use your iPad to play traditional board games with your children without the clutter of unwieldy boxes, but with the addition of engaging special effects, from silly sounds to amazing animation. Designed to be able to glide across the screen of the iPad without damaging the surface, these clever little counters from Jumbo add a whole new dimension gaming.



With eight downloadable games currently available, including old favourites like Snakes & Ladders and Ludo, as well as contemporary classics of the Fireman Sam and Pepper Pig ilk, iPieces offers an affordable, fuss-free alternative to the storage nightmare presented by conventional children's games. It also helps kids come to grips with technology, solves the issue of entertainment on the move and being designed for multi-player games, stops sibling squabbling. All in all, a great little idea.
